Resolution 2011 – 03

*To offer discounted ASCE dues to ASCE Student Chapter
Faculty Advisors*

WHEREAS, the New England Council recognizes the importance of having strong Faculty Advisors assigned to instill the lifelong academic and professional value of membership with the American Society of Civil Engineers at both the local and national levels.

WHEREAS, the New England Council recognizes that these appointed Faculty Advisors are often the first individuals to utter the words “American Society of Civil Engineers” to college students who have chosen to enter into a Civil Engineering curriculum.

WHEREAS, the New England Council recognizes the incredible importance of the “first ASCE impression” that these Faculty Advisors are charged with providing to potential lifelong members.


WHEREAS, the New England Council recognizes that these appointments are voluntary and their membership in ASCE and its local section/branches are often not supported financially by colleges and/or universities.

WHEREAS, the New England Council recognizes that many potential faculty advisors do not join ASCE because of competing personal financial commitments.

AND WHEREAS, the New England Council recognizes that Faculty Advisors are not required by national, regional, council, or section/branch governance to participate in any section/branch activities as a condition of their appointment as Faculty Advisor, and of further concern is that many Faculty Advisors opt not to pay section dues.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that in consideration for this commitment as Faculty Advisors, ASCE offer discounted dues to Faculty Advisors who demonstrate engagement with their local section/branch and who also encourage student members to attend/participate in a minimum of two (2) section/branch activities throughout the course of an academic year.
