GENERAL MEETING STRUCTURE:

The Utah YMF holds an open board meeting once a month. These meetings are dinner meetings where activities and service projects are planned. While everyone is invited, typically only the officers and committee chairs attend.

The two official meetings for the whole YMF assembly are our spring and fall BBQs. The fall BBQ is when officer elections are held.

MOST SUCCESSFUL MEETING:

Our Fall BBQ proved to be our most successful meeting this year. We had over 60 people in attendance. We also recruited two additional people to help chair a committee, as well as talked to students about helping them with any activity that they may have.

GROUP ACTIVITIES:

Striking Out Hunger – The YMF covered two games and shoe rentals for people that brought seven items of food for the Utah Food Bank. We collected 90 pounds of food and had 22 people attend.

Salt Lake Valley Science & Engineering Fair - The YMF volunteered in judging the science fair again this year. This year, with the support of the Wasatch Front Branch and the Utah Section, we were a sponsor of the fair and as well as presenting 9 ASCE awards (3 per age class). The sponsorship was \$500 and we gave \$380 in prize money. We also helped with the recruitment of other judges for the general awards. This has been a long standing yearly tradition with the YMF and will continue to be such.

National Association of Letter Carriers Food Drive – This service project was one in which we just had to provide people to help move food from the back of mail trucks into semitrailers. It was an exhausting event, but quite rewarding. The post office that the YMF covered collected the most food in the area at over 39,000 lbs. This was such a great event, especially since we only had to organize volunteers, not the activity itself.

Kickball Extravaganza – Kickball was our attempt at a summer activity. It was not well attended, but for the people that attended it was a good time. Plus, any activity that gets people moving always proves to be fun.

Ronald McDonald House Dinner – Serving dinner at the Ronald McDonald House, allowed the YMF members to show off their cooking talents. We served two kinds of chili, baked potatoes and topping with brownies and ice cream for dessert. We served approximately 40 people dinner.

IMPROVEMENTS FOR NEXT YEAR:

Among the many things we could improve on are member recruitment and retention. We have improved at offering a variety of activities that appeal to different demographic that we serve, however, we need to find ways to bring everyone together and keep them coming out.
